How does climate change affect animals and plants in the UK?



Phytoplankton → Zooplankton → Sandeels → puffins

Puffins feed their chicks on sandeels that feed on tiny plankton. Warmer water means that the copepods reproduce before the sandeels hatch creating a food shortage for sandeels and so fewer sandeels survive for the puffins to eat.



Bluebells flowering too early so they find it difficult to reproduce.

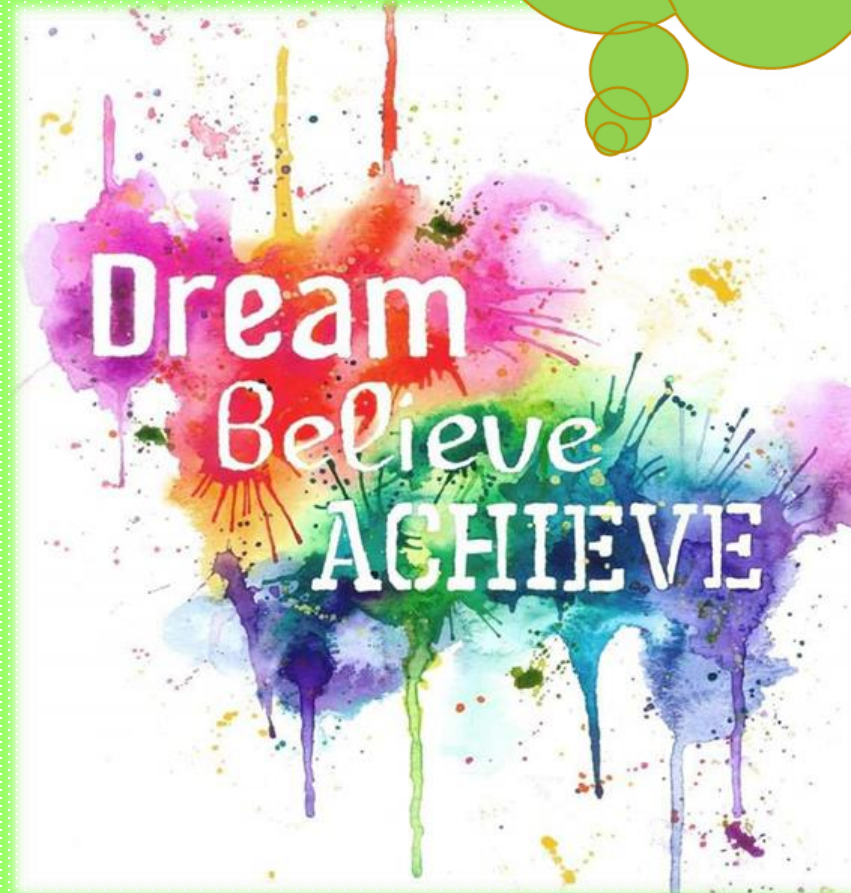
- Our eco-code tells us what we think we need to do.

- **To show that we care for our environment we will try to:**
- Put all recyclables in the bins with clear bags (paper, card, plastics).
- Put any rubbish in the bins with black bags.
- Reduce the amount of paper you use and reuse it when you can.
- Save water and turn off the taps.
- Use less toilet paper!
- Save energy by switching off lights and computers and the IWB; check when you leave rooms.
