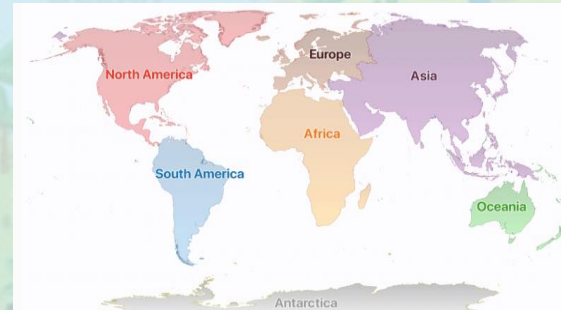
The Equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. It divides the world into the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.



The weather found in a certain place over a long period of time is known as the climate. An area's climate determines what kind of plants can grow and what kinds of animals can live there.



There are 7 continents in the world. Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Oceania.



The five oceans are the Pacific, Atlantic, Southern, Arctic, and Indian. These are large bodies of salt water that separate the seven continents of the Earth. Each ocean has its own unique properties and therefore its own unique marine life.
