# **Camera Mobile Phones and Wearable Technology**

Smart Phones with cameras are becoming increasingly popular and a built in digital camera enables users to take high resolution pictures. These can be sent instantly to other mobile phone users or email addresses. They can also be posted on the internet or in chat rooms. There is a potential for camera mobile phones to be misused in schools. They can become an instrument of bullying or harassment directed against pupils or/and staff. The use of Smart Watches is not appropriate in school due to risks of loss and damage and of misuse in the same way as mobile phones or tablets. Therefore, we would ask that you do not send children into school with these devices. Children in Year 5 and 6 who walk to and from school are able to bring their mobile phones to school however must be handed over to their class teacher or TA to be locked in the office during the school day.
